Clothing:

- 3. Sandals/Slippers (to let shoes air out)
- 4. Sleeping bag. Optional additions for comfort: blanket & pillow
- 5. \$10 Emergency Money
- 6. Toiletries (Toothbrush, toothpaste, hair brush or comb, face wash, hair ties, baby wipes or hand sanitizer, toilet paper (put in a ziploc bag), lotion, Chapstick, deodorant, menstruation products)
- 7. Towel & Shower products (There will be showers!) Quarters!!!
- 8. 4 Grocery Bags
- 9. Wipes for cleaning hands and body throughout the trip when away from camp
- 10. Chapstick (Definitely recommend)
- 11. Medication: If needed

- b. Campsite Rules:

Camping is a great time to spend time with family and friends, away from the bustle of the city and the siren song of electronics. Remember, there are no walls in the great outdoors, so be mindful of your neighbors and help keep everyone's vacation a pleasant one.

- Keep noise from electronics (including speakers, radios, televisions, or other noise-producing machines) to a minimum. Noise should not emit beyond your immediate campsite and disturb your neighbors.
- Quiet hours are from 10:00 pm to 6:00 am. Please be mindful of your neighbors who also want to enjoy their vacation! Turn off electronics and keep noise levels to a minimum.
- Generators may be operated between the hours of 10:00 am and 8:00 pm. Generators, even on RVs, must be off between the hours of 8:00 pm and 10:00 am.
- Campfires are permitted in the fire ring and concrete grills provided. Please do not build fires on picnic tables or on the ground!
- Campsites should be left clean for the next family. Your pleasure and pride in your parks will be enhanced when they are kept clean and it will help keep fees down. All litter must be deposited in a trash bin.

7) FVF Policies Review

LOST AND FOUND POLICY: Anything left behind on trips will go to the Felix Ventures Foundation Lost and Found. You have 7 days to claim your things before it is donated to the Salvation Army.

ELECTRONICS POLICY: No use of Phones, iPods, or Gaming Devices allowed DURING any FVF activities. Phone Use will ONLY be allowed in case of emergency.

DAMAGED EQUIPMENT/LOSS POLICY: We have checked all of our equipment. (What's broken, fixed, and etc.) You must return given equipment in the same condition it was given to you. You will be charged for returned damaged equipment. If you receive any equipment that already has any damage, let quartermasters, SPL, or any staff know immediately to avoid any charges.

72 HOURS CANCELATION POLICY: If for any reason you are no longer able to attend this trip, you must let one of the staff and or officers in charge know at least 72 hrs. before the trip. If you fail to do so, you will be penalized with negative points and may be placed in the alternate list for the next trip.

NEW - VOLUNTEER REQUIREMENT: Everyone attending the trip will be required to do ONE hour of volunteering for FVF after each trip you attend. Coming to the equipment cleaning, helping after school, helping making posters, helping in another event/trip will all count towards completion of the HOUR. Officers and SPL's/ASPL may be excused for completing the required hour with the permission of the directors. Failure to complete the hour may result in not being allowed to participate in future trips. Completion need to be made within 2 weeks after we come back from the trip. If you, the venturer, cannot complete the HOur in that time frame speak with FVF staff to possibly arrange an extension.
